BOROUGH OF ALPINE ORDINANCE NO. 816

BOND ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTIONS 1, 2, 3, 7 AND 9 OF THE BOND ORDINANCE (ORD. NO. 795) ENTITLED: "BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE 2020 ROAD PROGRAM IN AND BY THE BOROUGH OF ALPINE, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY; APPROPRIATING \$378,000 THEREFOR (INCLUDING A NEW JERSEY DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION GRANT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$154,000) AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$205,100 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE BOROUGH TO FINANCE PART OF THE COST THEREOF," ADOPTED APRIL 22, 2020.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Alpine, in the County of Bergen, State of New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1. Section 1 of Ordinance No. 795 entitled:

"BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE 2020 ROAD PROGRAM IN AND BY THE BOROUGH OF ALPINE, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY; APPROPRIATING \$378,000 THEREFOR (INCLUDING A NEW JERSEY DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION GRANT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$154,000) AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$205,100 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE BOROUGH TO FINANCE PART OF THE COST THEREOF"

adopted by the Borough Council of the Borough of Alpine, in the County of Bergen, New Jersey (the "Borough") on April 22, 2020 (the "Prior Ordinance") is hereby amended to (i) increase the appropriation made from \$378,000 to \$435,000 (an increase of \$57,000); and (ii) increase the down payment appropriated from \$18,900 to \$21,750 (an increase of \$2,850); and shall hereafter read as follows:

"SECTION 1. The improvement or purpose described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance is hereby authorized as a general improvement or purpose to be undertaken by the Borough of Alpine, in the County of Bergen, State of New Jersey (the "Borough"). For the said improvement or purpose stated in Section 3, there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$435,000, which sum includes a \$154,000 grant expected to be received from the New Jersey Department of Transportation (the "Grant") and \$21,750 as the amount of down payment for said improvement or purpose as required by the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-1 et seq. (the "Local Bond Law"). The down payment is now available by virtue of provisions in a previously adopted budget or budgets of the Borough for down payment or for capital improvement purposes."

Section 2. Section 2 of the Prior Ordinance is hereby amended to (i) increase the appropriation stated from \$378,000 to \$435,000 (an increase of \$57,000); and (ii) increase the amount of bonds or notes authorized from \$205,100 to \$259,250 (an increase of \$54,150), and shall hereafter read as follows:

"SECTION 2. For the financing of said improvement or purpose described in Section 3 hereof and to meet the part of said \$435,000 appropriation not provided by said Grant, negotiable bonds of the Borough are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$259,250 pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuance of said bonds and to temporarily finance said improvement or purpose, negotiable notes of the Borough in a principal amount not exceeding \$259,250 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law."

Section 3. Section 3 of the Prior Ordinance is hereby amended to (i) add Allison Road to the list of streets authorized to be resurfaced; (ii) increase the estimated maximum amount of bonds and notes stated from \$205,100 to \$259,250 (an increase of \$54,150); and (iii) increase the estimated cost of the improvement or purpose stated from \$378,000 to \$435,000 (an increase of \$57,000); and shall hereafter read as follows:

"SECTION 3. The improvement hereby authorized and purpose for the financing of which said bonds or notes are to be issued is for the resurfacing of various roadways, including, but not limited to, Alpine Drive, Old Quarry Road, Old Chapel Court, Cambridge Way, Allison Road, the Borough Hall parking lot and the Firehouse parking lot and design improvements to the Route 9W and Closter Dock Road intersection. Such improvement or purpose is to include, as applicable, milling, construction, reconstruction, repairing and resurfacing, drainage improvements, inlet, manhole and water valve replacements, the restoration or construction of or improvements to curbs, sidewalks, traffic line striping, driveway aprons or barrier-free ramps along such roadways, the acquisition and installation of traffic signals and signage and including all engineering and design work, surveying, construction planning, preparation of plans and specifications, permits, bid documents, construction inspection and contract administration, and all work, materials, equipment, labor and appurtenances necessary therefor or incidental thereto.

(a) The estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for said improvement or purpose is \$259,250.

(b) The estimated cost of said improvement or purpose is \$435,000."

Section 4. Section 7 of the Prior Ordinance is hereby amended to (i) increase the amount of gross debt of the Borough shown on the Supplemental Debt Statement filed for the ordinance, as amended, from \$205,100 to \$259,250 (an increase of \$54,150); and (ii) increase the amount of Section 20 expenses included in the cost of the purpose from \$80,000 to \$90,000 (an increase of \$10,000), and shall hereafter read as follows:

"SECTION 7. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

(a) The improvement or purpose described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance is not a current expense and is an improvement which the Borough may lawfully undertake as a general improvement, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby. (b) The average period of usefulness of said improvement or purpose within the limitations of the Local Bond Law, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the said bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is ten (10) years.

(c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Clerk of the Borough and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, New Jersey Department of Community Affairs, and such statement shows that the gross debt of the Borough as defined in the Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided in this bond ordinance by \$259,250 and the said bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

(d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$90,000 for items of expense listed in and permitted under Section 20 of the Local Bond Law is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for the purpose or improvement hereinbefore described."

Section 5. Section 9 of the Prior Ordinance is hereby amended to increase the maximum amount of bonds or notes stated to be issued to reimburse the Borough for expenditures on the improvement incurred prior to the issuance of the bonds or notes from \$205,100 to \$259,250 (an increase of \$54,150), and shall hereafter read as follows:

"SECTION 9. The Borough reasonably expects to reimburse any expenditures toward the costs of the improvement or purpose described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance and paid prior to the issuance of any bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance with the proceeds of such bonds or notes. No funds from sources other than the bonds or notes authorized herein have been or are reasonably expected to be reserved, allocated on a long-term basis or otherwise set aside by the Borough, or any member of the same "Controlled Group" as the Borough, within the meaning of Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-1(e), pursuant to its budget or financial policies with respect to any expenditures to be reimbursed. This Section 9 is intended to be and hereby is a declaration of the Borough's official intent to reimburse any expenditures toward the costs of the improvement or purpose described in Section 3 hereof to be incurred and paid prior to the issuance of bonds or notes authorized herein in accordance with Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2, and no further action (or inaction) will be an abusive arbitrage device in accordance with Treasury Regulation Section 1.148-10 to avoid the arbitrage yield restrictions or arbitrage rebate requirements under section 148 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"). The proceeds of any bonds or notes authorized herein used to reimburse the Borough for any expenditures toward the costs of the improvement or purpose described in Section 3 hereof will not be used directly or indirectly (i) to "refund" an issue of governmental obligations within the meaning of Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-1(d), (ii) to create, within one year, following the reimbursement of any expenditures of bond proceeds "replacement proceeds", within the meaning of Treasury Regulation Section 1.148-1 of the bonds, or any other bond issue, or (iii) to reimburse the Borough for any expenditure or payment that was originally paid with the proceeds of any obligation of the Borough (other than borrowing by the Borough from one of its own funds or the funds of a member of the same "Controlled Group" within the meaning of Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-1(e)). The bonds or notes authorized herein to reimburse the Borough for any expenditures toward the costs of the improvement or purpose described in Section 3 hereof will be issued in an amount not to exceed \$259,250. The costs to be reimbursed with the proceeds of the bonds or notes authorized herein will be "capital expenditures" in accordance with the meaning of section 150 of the Code and Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-1. This provision will take effect immediately, but will be of no effect with regard to expenditures for costs paid outside the permitted reimbursement period set forth in Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2(d)(2)."

Section 6. The capital budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this amendatory bond ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Borough Clerk and is available for public inspection.

Section 7. This ordinance shall take effect twenty days after the first publication thereof after final passage.
