MAYOR'S REPORT Mayor Tomasko reported on the following:

- Tax bills were mailed out. Payment for third quarter due September 5th. Councilman Cacouris wished to note the delay was at the County level.
- City of Englewood unanimously adopted a resolution calling for LG to lower the height
 of its proposed building as part of preservation of the Palisades viewshed. At least ten
 municipalities have passed similar resolutions.
- United Water advises they will be swapping out water meters.
- Letter received from Sharon A. Dunn, Bergen County Department of Health Services thanking Mrs. Wehmann for efforts resulting in 100% compliance for Alpine's Bloodborne Pathogen Training Program.
- Mr. Beckmann earned Certificates for Certified Municipal Registrar and Notary Public.
 He has completed three of the five courses required for Municipal Clerk certification.
 Council applauded his diligence.
- Letter from Thomas M. Melzer, Bergen County's Deputy Emergency Management Coordinator finding Alpine's Emergency Operations Plan for Alpine meets the planning requirements established by BCOEM along with compliments for the considerable effort that went into the development of the plan by Mr. Beckmann and colleagues.

REPORTS OF THE STANDING COMMITTEES

Administration Department No report.

Building Department Councilman Halbreich thanked Mr. Beckmann and Mrs. Booth for getting the Building department website up and running; it looks great. He further reported there were 78 scheduled inspections, 7 tree permits, 2 soil moving applications, 6 zoning review applications. The balance of the report is on file in the Clerk's office.

Department of Public Works Councilman Garjian noted DPW will be monitoring the microsurfaced roads over the long term. The compost site is being cleared and regraded in preparation for the 2014 Leaf Season. Staff attended JIF safety meetings. DPW cleared Boro pathways, made pot hole repairs, performed monthly townwide chipping and maintained equipment, repaired damaged street signs, responded to all daytime fire alarms, tended to tenant concerns, problems and repair work at the affordable housing units, including remediating one unit badly damaged by former tenants. Addressed residents' concerns via phone calls and meetings and submitted the 2013 Clean Communities Statistical Report.

DPW Foreman Frank Rickenbaugh submitted a letter dated August 18, 2014 addressed to DPW Supt. Wehmann and Mr. Beckmann stating that due to unforeseen conflicts in the DPW vacation/sick time schedule, he is requesting five of his 2014 vacation days be rolled over to 2015 with thanks for their time and consideration.

Discussion: Mayor Tomasko advised he had spoken with Mr. Wehmann who supports the request. Councilman Cacouris wished to point out that unlike other labor units this department has a policy of "use it or lose it" which is very important from an accumulative liability for the Borough and he commends that. He appreciates the notice and accepts the exception. Mayor Tomasko read the exact terminology from the employee manual, "Employees shall be required to take the annual vacation allotted to each employee during the fiscal year except for extenuating circumstances, a maximum of five days may be carried over with consent of the Mayor and Council."

BOROUGH ATTORNEY'S REPORT No report.

BOROUGH ENGINEER'S REPORT Mr. Vander Veer advised his report is on file and highlighted the following:

2014 Road Improvement Projects All three are substantially complete.

Timberline Drainage Improvement Project. Test holes are needed as part of the design phase to obtain mark outs and expose utilities for determination of size, precise location and depth in order to design a drain pipe to go over them. Project cost, estimated about 18 months ago, was \$16,000 with about \$1,000 allotted for the test holes. Request For Proposals were sent to four excavators. One has returned a quote of \$3,900.00 and a second promised a quote by day's end which Mr. Vander Veer has not yet seen.

Discussion followed on the best way to proceed and potential benefits of waiting versus acknowledging the patience of the resident most affected by street water entering their property who hoped to see action by summer's end. The test holes should take about a day and the work 2-3 days. These are two separate projects and Mr. Vander Veer anticipates seeking proposals from the same vendors for the actual improvement work. Council opted to allow Mr. Vander Veer to proceed with hopes that the second quote will come in over the next day or two and be lower.

Introduction of Ordinance 747 Amending Landscaper Ordinance

Councilman Garjian asked the definition of "landscaper". Attorney Huntington stated it is defined in the existing ordinance. Councilman Garijan acknowledged he has not read the ordinance. Attorney Huntington noted it makes a distinction between someone performing work for commercial or business purposes and a homeowner doing their own work. Councilman Garjian asked if that includes tree cutters noting past history of storms and potential need to work on Saturdays. Mayor Tomasko and Councilwoman Frankel stated it does not include tree cutters. Councilman Garjian asked if the ordinance could be construed as "cherry picking" if it doesn't include an excavator who might be working on demolition of a house or installation of a septic tank; it's singling out landscapers. He is not comfortable with the total "no landscaper shall perform any landscaping services within the confines of the Borough on Saturday or Sunday." He thinks that it is sort of draconian and that maybe there could be limits on the time on Saturday that they could perform the services but he has a host of concerns that he doesn't really know if he needs to take the time of everybody on the dais but a lot of workers employed by landscapers count on this work. There's a certain economy whether it's hidden or off the radar or on the radar economy. Councilman Gerstein offered they work during the week. Councilman Garjian sees landscapers working on Saturday. He recalled an event several years ago they were having septic work done on a Saturday where a neighbor requested they refrain due to a family event and they accommodated the request. He is just concerned as to whether the government of Alpine has to impose this when a neighbor could just ask a neighbor to refrain from having a landscaper come on Saturday. He is not sure if a draconian ban on Saturday landscaping is appropriate. On the other hand he understands the concern so maybe there should be a limit up to 2:00 PM or for Sabbath worshippers. He is not prepared to support it as written. Mayor Tomasko noted it is currently

banned on Sundays. They've added Saturdays. Councilman Cacouris stated he does value the quiet of his day and does not feel comfortable knocking on his neighbor's doors as often he does not know which one is responsible for the landscaper's activity. This ordinance clarifies it for him and his fellow Alpine citizens and therefore he fully endorses the proposal. Councilman Halbreich asked if the DPW would still be allowed to do leaf collection on Saturdays and Mayor Tomasko replied of course, that is not landscaping. Councilman Garijan again asked if this constitutes cherry picking noting he is trying to avoid any kind of potential problem. Attorney Huntington advised he does not know, if the landscapers as a group were to retain a counsel and try to get a definitive ruling on what is or isn't discriminatory regulation; he has no idea where that would lead. Councilman Garjian said for instance, if an excavator is hammering on a Saturday, that noise would be acceptable but this one isn't; he's just asking. Attorney Huntington responded that he think what comes with landscapers is leaf blowers, in particular, and lawn mowers so their activity is almost per se noise generating. Councilman Garjian noted so is excavators. Councilman Cacouris responded but that is not scheduled for every Saturday. Councilwoman Frankel noted Councilman Garijan had raised some issues and they should just vote on it and see where it goes.

ORDINANCE NO. 746

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 109 ENTITLED "FEES" TO AMEND THE REIMBURSEMENT FOR POLICE SERVICES

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Alpine that Section 109-2 entitled "Police Services" be deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

- **§ 109-2. Police Services.** Whenever the Chief of Police authorizes the assignment of a police officer or special officer to a quasi-public duty or a private activity which is necessary for safety or security, the party requesting such service shall reimburse the Borough of Alpine as follows:
- A. **Compensation for Services.** The rates of compensation for contracting the services of off-duty law enforcement officers shall be based on a rate equal to that of time and one-half of the contractual hourly rate for the individual officer being compensated. The party requesting the service shall not make any payment directly to the police officers. All payments shall be made to the Borough of Alpine.
- B. **Administrative Costs.** In addition, the party requesting such service shall pay a one-time fee for each project of \$100.00 to cover the administrative costs associated with the project.
- C. **Use of Police Vehicles.** If a party requests a police car or vehicle in conjunction with the services of a police officer or special officer, then the party shall pay the Borough of Alpine a reimbursement rate of \$150 per day for the use of each police vehicle.
- **BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED** that this Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication as required by law.
