AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 140 ENTITLED "LANDSCAPERS, LICENSING OF"

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Alpine that Section 140-5(C) under "Landscaper's Responsibility" be amended as follows:

§ 140-5(C) No landscaper shall perform any landscaping services within the confines of the Borough of Alpine on Saturday or Sunday.

If any section, subsection, part, clause or phrase of this Ordinance shall be declared invalid by judgment of any court of competent jurisdiction such section, subsection, part, clause or phrase shall be deemed to be severable from the remainder of this ordinance.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that this Ordinance, following final passage and publication as required by law, shall take effect January 1, 2015.
