#### PRESENTATION: 2019 VOLUNTEER OF THE YEAR AWARD

#### to Richard Glazer, Chairman Alpine Zoning Board of Adjustment

Mayor Tomasko honored Richard Glazer noting his service to the Borough and to his country as reported in the last issue of the Mayor & Council newsletter:

During his first year as an Alpine resident, Richard assisted in the effort to initiate an all-day Kindergarten program. He ran for and was elected to the Alpine Board of Education in 1975 and became its President in 1976. In 1982 he was appointed to the Alpine Zoning Board of Adjustment and served on the Board for three years. He was again appointed to the Board of Adjustment by Mayor Tomasko in 2005 and currently serves as its Chairman. The Borough recognized Richard Glazer as 2017 Memorial Day Grand Marshal for his U.S. Army service from 1961-1967.

Along with Council President Frankel the Mayor presented Mr. Glazer with a plaque naming him "2019 Volunteer of the Year for your service to the Alpine Board of Adjustment over (the dates mentioned) with deep appreciation for your continued commitment to the betterment of the Borough through your enduring altruism and extraordinary sense of community spirit.

#### PUBLIC COMMENTS

John Patrick McCaffrey, 203 Hickory Lane, Closter, NJ, Alpine tax payer and past resident, discussed the Alpine Three matter before the Planning Board. Mr. McCaffrey stated the applicant incorrectly refers to the spring on the property as an abandoned well where a judge has ruled it is a spring. He asked the Borough to encourage the Planning Board to direct the Borough engineer along with a hydrogeologist along with the Borough engineer to take a very close look at the spring waters on the property. He states this freshwater spring produces 14,000 gallons+ a day flowing to an important C-1 native trout stream resource on Duck Pond Road and the DuBois spring has been so designated for over 150 years. Mr. McCaffrey claims since inception of the project the applicant has been deceptive with their filings with DEP by denoting the spring as an abandoned well on their plans. Applicant's plans locate the spring under the concrete floor of proposed Unit 5. He encouraged the Borough to ascertain if the applicant has clear title to the property which Mr. McCaffrey stated they could not obtain because of the spring and the road to the spring.

#### BOROUGH OF ALPINE ORDINANCE NO. 789

#### AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 119 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF ALPINE ENTITLED "FIRE PREVENTION" TO PROVIDE FEES FOR NON-LIFE HAZARD REGISTRATION AND FIRE WATCH

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Alpine, Bergen County, New Jersey that Chapter 119 of the Municipal Code of the Borough of Alpine entitled "Fire Prevention" be amended as follows:

1. Section 119-3 H. shall be added to read as follows:

Non-Life Hazard Uses. The local enforcing agency shall carry out periodic inspections of non-life hazard uses required by the Uniform Fire Code on behalf of the Commission of Community Affairs.

- 2. Section 119-12 Fees. shall be amended to read as follows:
  - 1. The fees for each inspection and issuance of a certificate shall be those established by the New Jersey State Uniform Fire Code, as amended from time to time.

The fees for annual non-life-hazard registration are as established by resolution of the Governing Body.
All non-life hazard use groups shall be inspected every two years. At the discretion of the Fire Official, vacant buildings or use groups shall be registered and inspected according to the previous use of the building or structure.
Fire Watch

A. Daily fee for the Fire Official to inspect a site for fire lane approval, equipment, fire protection inspection (exists, special effects, etc.) and an inspection on the day(s) of event the fee shall be \$100.00.

B. In the event the Fire Official requires fire equipment to be at the site, the charge for each vehicle for each eight-hour shift or part thereof shall be \$200.00.

C. The charge for a standby or active firefighter as determined by the Fire Official shall be at the hourly overtime rate for a Department of Public Works employee for a minimum of four hours plus an administration fee of 15% applied for the person.

D. If a fire safety permit is required, the fee shall be charged in accordance with this chapter.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that this Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication as required by

law.
