MAYOR'S REPORT

- Mayor Tomasko thanked voters of Alpine for their confidence for him and his running mates which affords them the privilege to serve as elected officials.
- Mayor Tomasko attended the annual League of Municipalities conference in Atlantic City last week and hopes one or two members will accompany him next year. They have a full schedule of programs, exhibitors and classes, and if anyone is interested in seeing it, reach out to the Mayor.
- Elected officials receive a municipality magazine, and the Mayor encouraged the Council to check out the latest November edition; particularly on 1) page 10 regarding BCLM calling for OPRA review and reform, 2) an article on risk management which provides an insight into the budget on health insurance and insurance costs, and 3) on page 88 an article on the state of affordable housing where the State League of Municipalities lay out a blue print calling law makers to make comprehensive reforms to the state's affordable housing policy.

- **Building Department** Councilman Kupferschmid reported: 61 scheduled inspections, 1 driveway permit, 3 fence permits, 8 tree permits, 5 zoning reviews, 1 sign permit, 5 miscellaneous. Rest of report on file.
- **Department of Public Works** Councilman Frankel reported on November 6, 2022 there was a loss of power due to a transformer explosion.
