#### **MAYOR'S REPORT**

- 2nd Quarter Safety Committee Meeting attended by Chairperson Stephanie Wehmann, DPW Superintendent, Police Chief, and Borough's Risk Management Consultants. Alpine is in good shape in meeting expectations and qualified for the 2022 maximum MEL assessment credit \$250 for each member, up to the maximum, that took the highly recommended training course.

- Alpine Swim Club has approximately 50 families with varying membership units. Mayor Tomasko thanked Scott Bosworth and Sub-committee members for getting us to this point. There are 10 Lifeguards and a few others in the process of getting vetted in terms of paperwork and certifications.

- NJDOT has finally authorized the Borough to enter into a contract with AJM Contractors to repave Cambridge Way (2020 NJDOT Municipal Aid Project). Plan is to complete this project before school starts.
- The County requested final plans for Closter Dock Road and Route 9W intersection last week. We will contact the County Engineer for this project to be included in the County's construction program for this year. Mayor Tomasko elaborated that this is to extend the right-hand turning lane so that the traffic does not back up all the way down

Closter Dock Road. We have been pushing for this improvement for the past four years and hopefully it will come to fruition soon.

• FY 2023 NJDOT Municipal Aid Project Grant Application is for improvements to Anderson Avenue but may need to be split into two sections due to length and width of the road. Recommend applying for one section in 2023 and the remaining section in 2024.

**WHEREAS**, these quotes were reviewed, and a recommendation made by the Police Chief for award to Certified Speedometer Service, Inc of Old Tappan, NJ as the lowest responsive, responsible quote totaling \$18,000.00, and

**WHEREAS**, funds for this purpose have been provided for in the 2022 Capital Budget Account (ORD. 814) as identified by Account Number C-04-55-996-204 in the accounting records of the Borough of Alpine; and

WHEREAS, the cumulative total for this vendor in fiscal year 2022 will exceed the quote threshold of \$6,600.00;

# <u>Resolution #122:06'2022: Urging New Jersey Legislature to Amend Budget Cap Law to Appropriate Funds for Increasing Insurance Costs</u>

OFFERED BY: Councilwoman Frankel SECONDED BY: Councilwoman Gerstein

At a regular meeting of the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Alpine, held on Wednesday, June 22, 2022,

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45, et al, a municipality is required to limit any increase in its levy to 2.0% and any increase in appropriations to 2 1/2% or the cost-of-living adjustment, whatever is less, over the prior year's final appropriations subject to certain exceptions; and

WHEREAS, all local public entities, including participating municipalities in the Municipal Excess Liability Joint Insurance Fund (MEL), has incurred an estimated \$50 million in COVID related worker's compensation claims and it is anticipated that these costs will continue to increase as a result of long-term COVID cases; and

**WHEREAS**, a 2021 New Jersey Department of Labor decision regarding worker's compensation funding has generated increased costs to the members of the MEL by over 10% in order to cover claims that were previously funded by the State pension system; and

WHEREAS, a recent amendment to the sexual molestation statute of limitations will increase total liability costs for members of the MEL system by an estimated amount of 6% in 2023; and

**WHEREAS**, the frequency of weather-related catastrophic claims and corresponding impacts are anticipated to increase property insurance costs by over 10% per year; and

**WHEREAS**, cyber liability events throughout the country have resulted in twice the amount of premium costs in 2022 and such costs are expected to accelerate at a pace far greater than the rate of inflation; and

**WHEREAS**, these increasing costs, regulations, policy decisions and environmental impacts are occurring when many other items and costs in municipal budgets are also increasing at an inflationary rate; and

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by the Governing Body of the Borough of Alpine that N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45 be amended to provide that appropriations in the first three years after the effective date of (this amendment) for liability insurance, worker's compensation insurance, cyber insurance, and property insurance be exempt from the Appropriation CAP and the Levy CAP.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that a copy of this resolution shall be sent to the New Jersey Legislative representative for the Borough of Alpine.
