COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Northern Valley Mayors & Planners Assoc.: Mayor Tomasko reported that he attended a meeting on April 28th. The subject was a massive resolution which was passed by the Bergen County League of Municipalities calling for OPRA (Open Public Records Act) reform. Municipalities are being inundated with requests for public information. The problem is with commercial requesters who, for example, are asking for names, addresses and phone numbers and all information on file of all dog owners in town. These requests have become a major imposition on towns, some of which have had to hire additional staff just to handle such requests. Additionally, it is a potential serious invasion of privacy and security. He and the Borough Clerk were involved in drafting the resolution, which was unanimously approved by the Bergen County League of Municipalities at their April 11, 2022 meeting, with copies to be sent to all State Legislators. The Mayor offered to share a copy of the resolution with any member having an interest in obtaining more information.

The Mayor suggested that going forward, the report of the Northern Valley Mayors & Planners Assoc., who meet sporadically at best, should be replaced on the Planning Board agenda with the Bergen County League of Municipalities, who meet on a regular basis and deal with much more substantive matters.

<u>Board of Health</u>: A meeting was held on May 10th. The Environmental Health Specialist gave her report and is about to inspect the Swim Club, which we hope to have open on Memorial Day. The report details the extent of activity in the town. Ms. Parilla asked if there is current COVID data available. The Mayor replied we have access to that information from the County, but they are not updating the information as often as they had been. Locally, we don't have the most accurate data because the results of home testing are not always reported.

<u>Environmental Commission</u>: Ms. Mattes reported that Arbor Day was a huge success. She commented on a challenge they are facing with trees being removed for installation of septic systems, and is concerned that this exemption is being abused. She noted on a particular property that trees were removed which did not appear to be close to the proposed septic area. Mr. Frenzel explained that there are two systems being installed on that property; the blackwater system is in back. The second system will come up toward the front on the house, so that space was needed to accommodate that system.

<u>Building Dept</u>: Ms. Parilla noted that on the Property Maintenance Report there is mention of Violations to Court Order, and asked what this means. The Mayor responded that a property owner is being issued summonses because of violations to previous court orders. The matter is before the Municipal Court.

NJ Transit Update: No update. COAH Update: No update.

OTHER MATTERS: The Mayor mentioned that the Memorial Day Parade and Ceremony will be held on Monday, May 30th and he hopes to see everyone there.

<u>ADJOURNMENT:</u> A motion to adjourn the regular Planning Board meeting was made by Mayor Tomasko and seconded by Ms. Gerstein. All were in favor. The meeting adjourned at 7:51 PM.
